## **Leader's Oral Opening Comments**

You the leader Quote II. 9 Benefits — do not read them— quote them, rattle them off and then ask "Anyone here who does not want these benefits?" — pause — then continue, "Alright let us go and discover them right now."

> Close by asking each participant what he found most beneficial.

- > Part I "Jesus help me to use these benefits wisely," then pray over each of these 9 benefits.
- ➤ Part II "Jesus help me to make the same commitments you made," from the Gospels with your group find a verse for each commitment and pray accordingly.

- Possibly divide the discussion questions into 2 parts.

### **DVD** lecture Usage

> Stop the video briefly as soon as you hear the words "The content dimension is especially clear from the Scripture and the Gospel Paul was preaching." This is at section III.C.3. Use the illustration of a chain to explain 2 Timothy 2:2 to your students. Ask them how many links there are in the chain, and have them identify the links (They should have 4). When you are satisfied they understand the concept; you may carry on watching the video.
